FURTHER INFORMATION	Limited access course, subject to availability following the application submission chronological order. For the a.y. 2022/2023 the available positions for the degree course in Economics and Management of Innovation and Sustainability are 640 and will be thus divided: 600 positions reserved for Italian, EU and non-EU citizens legally residing in Italy, 40 positions reserved for non-EU citizens residing abroad, 10 of which are reserved for People's Republic of China citizens residing abroad who adhere to the Marco Polo and Turandot projects. The terms for participation will be detailed in a call which will be published at the beginning of July. Enrollment opens approximately mid-July 2022.
	Degree course taught in Italian.
	In compliance with Ministerial Decree no. 270/2004, although the course has been organized to be accessible by students with the basic skills shared by all high school diplomas, students enrolled in the first year of the Degree Course in Economics and Management of Innovation and Sustainability (also after course changes, transfers from other universities or career shortening) have to take a non-selective test to assess their educational background in basic mathematics.
	The test is not binding nor selective for the purposes of enrollment.
ADMISSION, ASSESSMENT OF EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND	The test must be taken even by students submitting a course change or transfer application to enroll in the first year, with the exception of those who have already passed a Mathematics exam in the previous career, even if at another university.
ADDITIONAL LEARNING REQUIREMENTS (OFA) REMEDIAL PROCEDURES	The test, structured on multiple-choice questions, concentrates on the basic quantitative skills (polynomials, equations and inequalities, analytic geometry) through the e-learning platform, following the procedures and timelines defined in the specific detail page: www.uninsubria.it/verifica-clemis (in Italian) To pass the test, students have to answer correctly at least 50% of the questions.
	Otherwise, should correct answers be fewer than 50%, students will be assigned an additional learning requirement (OFA) whose fulfillment will be attested by students passing the test in one of the following sessions by the end of the first year, following the calendar that will be published on the specific web page. In order to help students prepare and pass the test, the University's Orientation Office, in collaboration with the DC, organizes a Mathematics Pre-course, which takes place between the end of August and the first half of September,



	before the beginning of lessons, and is aimed at those students who intend to strengthen their educational background before taking the test.
	In order to meet the OFA, the DC offers students a tutoring service, in which the tutors of the quantitative field are available to help students on specific difficulties.
	The learning requirement (and consequently the assessment of the educational background) is nonetheless met if, by September of the year of first enrollment:
	1. students have obtained at least 12/30 in a test, even an interim test, of the Mathematics exam (ECO0349) of the Full-Time CLEMIS course, or in the Mathematics 1 exam (ECO0349) of the Part-Time CLEMIS course; or
	2. students have obtained at least 30 ECTS in the courses of the 1st year (this applies both to students enrolled in the Full-time degree course and to students enrolled in the Part-Time degree course).
	Should students not meet the learning requirement, they will be enrolled in the a.y. 2022/2023 to the first year as "repeating students".
ADDITIONAL PREPARATORY TEACHING ACTIVITIES FOR THE EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND ASSESSMENT TEST	First-year students, in order to help them pass the educational background assessment test and start their university curriculum without additional educational requirements, are invited to attend the Mathematics Pre-course. III. RULES FOR THE CURRICULUM

At enrollment, students have to select one of the two degree classes on which the degree course is activated (L-18 - Economics and Business Management science and L-33 - Economics), in order to choose the class in which they intend to obtain the qualification. This choice will have to be confirmed or modified when registering for all other subsequent years, provided that it becomes definitive during the 3rd years (Full-Time CLEMIS course) or 4th year (Part-Time CLEMIS course).

PREREQUISITES - FULL-TIME COURSE

Prerequisites have the double function of setting students on the course of a gradual and harmonious learning of the contents of the courses and of imposing the observance of graduating timeframes.

In this context, the passage from the first to the second year is subject to having obtained at least 30 ECTS by the exam session of September 2023 (included). Students who have obtained 30 ECTS but who have not passed all first-year exams may enroll in the second year and take the relative exams, abiding by the following prerequisites between first-year and second-year exams:

Courses that cannot be taken (2nd year):	If students have not passed the course in (1st year):
- Quantitative methods (Module 2 Mathematics 2)	- Mathematics 1
- Accounting and financial statements	- Management
- Commercial law	- Private law

To pass from the second to the third year, students must have passed all first-year exams and have obtained at least second-year 30 ECTS by the September 2024 exam session (included).

PREREQUISITES - PART-TIME COURSE

In the part-time course, first- and second-year courses (except for the English language exam) are preparatory for fourth-year ones; therefore, fourth-year exams may be taken only if all first- and second-year exams have been passed and registered (with the exception on the English language exam).

VALIDATION OF LINGUISTIC AND IT CERTIFICATIONS

Students who already hold a certification which attests a B2 level of the English language may submit a validation application to the Students Services Office.

Certifications obtained in the previous five years with regard to the validation application date may be validated (as agreed upon by the Department's Board of 28 May 2018 and following resolution of 27 May 2019), with the exception of IELTS, TOEFL IBT, TOEFL CBT and TOEFL PBT certifications, which have a duration of two years.

Validation of other certifications

Students who hold a EUCIP CORE Level Certificate may submit a validation application to the Student procedures committee to have the "Information systems and soft skills for digital businesses" (6 ECTS) validated. The validation will be assessed as a qualification.

VALIDATION OF PROFESSIONAL ABILITIES OR EXAMS TAKEN IN A PREVIOUS CAREER

In case of enrollment with a previous career validation application, the Department, taking into consideration the specific educational objectives of the degree course and anyways in compliance with the educational obligations established by the course's own Curriculum, ensures the validation of the maximum possible number of ECTS. For the purposes of the validation, meetings and tests may be required in order to assess the actual level of previously acquired knowledge.

Some exams may be only partly validated; in this case, students will be asked to integrate the missing syllabus portion, which should be agreed upon together with the course lecturer. Supplementary exams may be taken, after having registered, only in the exam session and not during interim tests sessions.

The Department will consider ECTS obtained 10 years before the validation application as obsolete, therefore in this case it will not approve the validation request, nor agree upon supplementary tests and/or exams.

Thanks to the current Agreement with the Association of Certified Public Accountants, Auditors and Advisors in Varese, the graduates of the Degree Course and Part-time Degree Course in Economics and Management (who have put the Programming and Control or Management Control exams in their study plan) may skip the first task of the State Exam to access the profession of Chartered accountant.

Moreover, thanks to the current agreements with the Association of Certified Public Accountants, Auditors and Advisors in Varese and with the Association of Labor Consultants in Varese, students may carry out a professional internship for 6 months during the last year, under the supervision of a professional who is registered to the Association. The internship with the Association of Certified Public Accountants, Auditors and Advisors in Varese is open only to the students of the Degree Course in Economics and Management who have put the Programming and Control or Management Control exams in their study plan.

ATTENDANCE OBLIGATION: NOT APPLICABLE

While not mandatory, attendance is strongly recommended. Please note that it is also possible to attend lessons even if the enrollment procedure has not been completed yet. However, in order to access the academic services, such as e-learning tools, email and the ESSE3 application for the management of their academic careers, University credentials are mandatory. It is therefore important to proceed swiftly with enrollment, in order to complete the procedure by the beginning of the lessons.

ENROLLING IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS

1st to 2nd year passage, full-time course

Starting from students who enrolled in the a.y. 2022/2023 passing from the first to the second year of the full-time CLEMIS course is subject to having obtained at least 30 ECTS by the September exam session of the year after enrollment. Therefore,



students who enroll in the a.y. 2022/2023 may access the second year only if they have obtained at least 30 ECTS in the first-year exams by September 2023 (included).

Students who have obtained 30 ECTS but who have not passed all first-year exams may enroll in the second year and take the relative exams, abiding by the following prerequisites between first-year and second-year exams, as mentioned above:

Courses that cannot be taken (2nd year):	If students have not passed the course in (1st year):
- Quantitative methods (Module 2 Mathematics 2)	- Mathematics 1
- Accounting and financial statements	- Management
- Commercial law	- Private law

Failure to obtain the 30 ECTS - 1st year

Students who have not obtained the 30 ECTS by September 2023 and want to continue studying have two options:

- 1) enroll, by submitting a course transfer application, with validation of the exams they have already taken, in the second year of the part-time CLEMIS;
- 2) enroll in the first year of the full-time CLEMIS course as "repeating students". During the first year as "repeating students", students may attend the first-year courses again and take only the missing exams.

2nd to 3rd-year passage, Full-Time course

To pass from the second to the third year, students must have passed all first-year exams and have obtained at least second-year 30 ECTS by the September exam session (included).

Failure to obtain the ECTS - 2nd year

Students who do not pass all first-year exams by the second-year fall session (September session), or who have passed all first-year exams but have not obtained a minimum of 30 ECTS in the second-year exams by the September exam session (included), and want to continue studying, have two options:

- 1) enroll, by submitting a course transfer application, with validation of the exams they have already taken, in the third year of the part-time CLEMIS;
- 2) enroll in the second year of the full-time CLEMIS course as "repeating students". During the second year as "repeating students", students may attend all first- and second-year courses again and take only the missing exams.

The abovementioned rules, regulating the passage from the first to the second year, and from the second to the third year, apply only to the full-time CLEMIS course, especially as far as the 30 ECTS thresholds are concerned.

TRASFER PROCEDURE FROM OTHER DEGREE COURSES

In case of transfers from other Universities, or change from another degree course, the Department, taking into consideration the specific educational objectives of the course and anyways in compliance with the educational obligations established by the course's own Curriculum, ensures the validation of the maximum possible number of ECTS. For the purposes of the validation, meetings and tests may be required in order to assess the actual level of previously acquired knowledge.

In case of changes from one course to another organized by the same Class L-18 or L-33 classes and characterized by substantial homogeneity in the curricula, the number of automatically validated ECTS for the same academic field may not be lower than 50% of the ECTS that students have already obtained. The assessment for the validation of ECTS is carried out by the Department's Students procedures committee.

Some exams may be only partly validated; in this case, students will be asked to integrate the missing syllabus portion, which should be agreed upon together with the course lecturer. Supplementary exams may be taken, after having registered, only in the exam session and not during interim tests sessions.

The Department will consider ECTS obtained 10 years before the validation application as obsolete, therefore in this case it will not approve the validation request, nor agree upon supplementary tests and/or exams.

RULES FOR THE SUBMISSION OF STUDY PLANS AND INDIVIDUAL STUDY PLANS

Students enrolled in the full-time course have to submit their study plan online during the third year to indicate optional course, elective courses, internships and alternative activities, following the procedures that will be communicated by the Department's Academic office.





Students enrolled in the part-time course have to submit their study plan online during their fourth year to indicate optional courses, elective course, internships or internship alternative activities, following the procedures that will be communicated by the Department's Academic office.

The AIQUA Committee of the DC will organize some orientation meetings to help students choose optional and elective courses.

Study Plans that conform to the educational curriculum provided in the ministerial database will be automatically approved, following the procedure provided by the Students Services Regulations for the submission of study plans.

Otherwise, students can submit an individual study plan, provided that this is coherent with the cultural project and suitable for the educational objectives and specific contents of the Degree Course in Economics and Management of Innovation and Sustainability. Individual study plans, which will have to adhere to the minimum ECTS in the different fields established by the Educational curriculum, will be approved by the coordinator of the degree course.

Excess courses

Should students enter in their study plan other courses besides those required to obtain the qualification, these will be counted as excess courses. ECTS acquired for excess courses will be registered in the students' careers and may count for further recognitions pursuant to current regulations. The marks thus obtained are not included in the exams average score (Article no. 20, paragraph 5 of the University's Teaching Regulations).

In order to facilitate access to master's degree courses, students enrolled in a degree course may include in their study plan no more than two extra courses besides those required to obtain the qualification. ECTS and The ECTS and the marks obtained for extra courses will not be included in the exams average score but will be registered in their career (Article no. 21 of the University's Students Regulations).
