ADMISSION, VERIFICATION OF INITIAL KNOWLEDGE AND REMEDIAL ADDITIONAL TRAINING OBLIGATIONS (OFA)	To be admitted to the Master's degree course, students must hold a three-year university degree or diploma, or another qualification obtained abroad and recognised as suitable. Admission is direct for students who have obtained a three-year degree in the following classes: L-10 (Humanities) pursuant to DM 270/04 (all curricula) or in the corresponding class 5 (Humanities) pursuant to DM 509/99 (degree courses in Modern Humanities, all curricula and in Classical and Oriental Antiquities, all curricula) or in the corresponding class 11 (Modern Languages and Cultures) pursuant to DM 270/04 (all curricula) or in the corresponding class 11 (Modern Languages and Cultures); L-20 (Communication Sciences), pursuant to DM 509/99. The personal preparation of all candidates - admitted to the interview as graduates belonging to the degree classes listed above - will be verified through a discussion on topics related to the main disciplines that will be the focus of the new degree course. The interview will be conducted by a special Commission, made up of lecturers appointed by the Degree Course Council; during the interview, in addition to checking the preparation and previous curriculum of the candidates, there will be a moment of dialogue between the Commission lecturers and the candidates, in order to understand their specific training objectives and professional ambitions. The interview schedule will be communicated to those interested. A negative outcome of the interview will result in being barred from access to the degree course. In addition, skills in a foreign language other than Italian of at least level B2

III. **REGULATIONS**

PREREQUISITES:

None

RECOGNITION OF LANGUAGE AND COMPUTER CERTIFICATIONS:

As mentioned in connection with the admission procedures to the degree course, certification is required for skills in a foreign language other than Italian, at least level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages CEFR.

RECOGNITION OF PROFESSIONAL SKILLS OR EXAMINATIONS OBTAINED IN PREVIOUS CAREER

Pursuant to Article 5 paragraph 7 of Ministerial Decree 270/04, the Course Council may recognise:

• professional knowledge and skills certified in accordance with the relevant regulations;

• knowledge and skills acquired in training activities at post-secondary level in whose implementation and design the university participated.

The application for recognition will be assessed by the Course Council. Recognition may be granted if the activity is consistent with the specific training objectives of the course of study and the training activities for which recognition is requested, also taking into account the content and duration in hours of the activity carried out.

The maximum number of credits that can be recognised is 12 ECTS credits.

ATTENDANCE OBLIGATIONS: There is no obligation to attend, with the exception of the Additional Training Activities (workshops and seminars), which require attendance at least 75% of the classroom activities, in addition to the final examination.

ENROLMENT IN YEARS FOLLOWING THE FIRST: No thresholds

TRANSFER FROM OTHER DEGREE COURSES

A student coming from another University or from another Degree Course of Study of this University, or from previous curricula, may request a transfer/passage to the Degree Course. Transfer/pass requests will be evaluated by the Course of Study Council, which will formulate the recognition of university credits on the basis of the following criteria:

• analysis of the programme carried out;

• evaluation of the congruity of the scientific disciplinary fields and the contents of the training activities, passed by the student in his or her previous career, with the specific training objectives of the course of study and the individual training activities envisaged in the course of study.

REGULATIONS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF STUDY PLANS AND INDIVIDUAL STUDY PLANS

Students must submit their Study Plan in their first year, with the possibility of amending it in the following year, according to the University's administrative calendar. Information on submission and completion can be found on the **web pages of the Student Office**. The student's choice of educational activities can be chosen from all the courses offered by the University,



with the exception of some integrated courses offered by degree courses in the healthcare area with programmed numbering. To check the constraints of choice, please contact the Student Office of reference.

The Course Council will assess the coherence of the above-mentioned choice activities with the training course in which the student has enrolled. When submitting his/her study plan, the student must choose the courses envisaged for the first and second year and arranged in choice blocks.

FURTHER EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

In order to acquire the training credits envisaged under 'Further educational activities' (4 ECTS credits), the student may:

- attend seminars/workshops, previously included in the career plan, organised by the Course of Study for at least 75% of the hours of classroom activities (in addition to the final examination). To encourage student attendance, some hours of each seminar/workshop may be delivered remotely;
- attend training/refresher courses organised by the University in which the acquisition of ECTS credits for the coverage of 'Further Education Activities' is declared with the award of the degree;
- For working students, there is the possibility of covering the credits of Further Education activities by taking additional elective examinations.

Seminars/workshops or any additional elective examinations must be included in the study plan before they can be attended.

INTERNSHIP

The student will be required to carry out an external internship at educational establishments, companies and public or private organisations or an internal internship at research groups under the supervision of a university tutor, as an experimental thesis. The internship - amounting to 150 hours of activity - may be carried out by the student when he/she has acquired at least 60 ECTS credits relating to the subjects included in his/her study plan. Students who are unable to undertake the external internship at companies or other organisations are permitted - subject to presentation of suitable documentation to the Internship Commission - to cover the required credits by undertaking an internal curricular internship or experimental thesis.

FINAL EXAMINATION

At the end of the second year there is a final examination, which enables undergraduates to accrue the credits required to reach a total of 120 ECTS credits. The final examination, the teaching load of which corresponds to 12 ECTS credits, consists of the defence of a thesis written in original form by the student under the guidance of a supervisor (possibly assisted by one or more co-supervisors). The Master's Thesis must consist of the composition of an original written work, relating to a specific research theme, consistent with the candidate's preparation, studies and training objectives. The judgement of the dissertation may lead to an increase in marks, compared to the average, as detailed below: up to 2 points above the average for compilative theses (sufficient), up to 4 points for adequately structured and documented theses (good), up to 6 points for theses elaborated with good reconstruction capacity, completeness of information and critical analysis insights (very good). In addition, the Commission may award up to 8 points for theses that show particularly outstanding abilities in the phases of collecting documentation and bibliographic material and in the critical processing of information, as well as in the overall organisation of the thesis and in the written exposition (very good). The Commission will also have the faculty to increase the final mark by a further 2 points if the student has acquired at least 7 seminar points over the two-year period through attendance of conferences/meetings offered by the CdS, subject to evaluation by the CCdS. The distinction of honours, upon proposal of the President or the supervisor, will be awarded to undergraduates whose final score corresponds to 110/110 and who have obtained at least 2 honours in the degree course examinations.
